REGISTRATION IS OPEN, and space is limited, registration will be accepted in order received(complete/paid in full).

Registration tips

1) Choose an area of instruction from the provided events

a. Campers must register for only one event category area of instruction. b. Some Events may be limited in size. Register Early

2) Registration deadline is June 15.

3) Registration will not be accepted unless ALL forms are completed and signed and fees paid in full by June 15. Registration will be accepted in order received.

4) Be advised that ONLY the following instruction areas require the camper to bring their own horse:

Barrel Racing, Pole Bending, Goat Tying, Tie Down Roping, Team Roping, and Breakaway Roping

5) Please make sure all information entered is accurate and as complete as possible. Please type "n/a" or "none" if a question is not applicable.

6) All registrations are subject to Camp Director Approval.

7) You must be at least 18 years of age, or have legal guardianship of the camper being registered to continue.

8) If a camper is not accompanied by a parent/legal guardian for the duration of the camp, then you must fill out the Temporary Guardianship form.

9) All Campers must be at least 11 and not over 18* years of age on Jan 1, 2023. *Graduating seniors welcome, even if 19.

10) Medical insurance coverage is required for all campers. No Exceptions! We will not be able to hold your spot without all the required documents/information.

Camp location

Ted Rice Arena, 500 E Walnut, Coulee City, WA

Arrival Date/Time

Campers may arrive at 1pm Sunday June 23th, 2024 Please check in upon arrival And no early arrivals without pre authorization. Dinner will be served.

Check-In

Upon arrival, please check in at the office first, and meet your small group leader (if you are bringing a horse we will direct you from the office as to where to stall your horse and unload your gear.)

Stalls

All horses must be stalled overnight, no horses allowed in the rv hook up areas. Tack stalls will be set up for each team so bring a saddle stand and lockable trunk if desired(recommended) There will be no need to walk horses to the trailer for tacking. The event you sign up for will determine where your horse will be stalled. Barrels will be in the 4H Arena. *All stalls must be cleaned at least twice a day and stripped before leaving camp. **1 bag of shavings per stall will be provided.

Livestock

If you are riding in a timed event you must bring your own horse, not all events will have fenced in arenas so please keep that in mind, we want all kids to be safely mounted. Goats, calves, roughstock etc. will be provided. Camper is required to bring equipment appropriate for event signed up for, if you have questions on this please contact us.

Refunds

As horse/livestock owners we realize that things come up, horses get injured. We are happy to refund in those situations although there may be a processing fee (not to exceed \$20?) Vet note is required.

Cancellations prior to May 31st will be honored with a \$20 processing fee. After May 31st refunds will be 50%. Unless a vet note is presented in which case a full refund will be issued minus the \$20 processing fee.

Meals

Camper meals are included in registration fee. Additional meals may be purchased for individuals or a family. Meals include Dinner June 25th(arrival day) Breakfast, lunch and Dinner monday and Tuesday and breakfast and lunch on Wednesday(9 meals).

Payment

Payment must be received by June 1st. Check payable to Aces Wild Rodeo Bible Camp. If paying via check and check does not clear a fee will be assessed. * Sending your registration in

without payment doesn't guarantee a spot in camp or in the event you most want. Complete registration(all forms, payment, camping etc) will be accepted first. Venmo:

CHECKLIST

WHAT TO BRING

If you are participating in a roughstock event please bring the gear that you have, helmet, mouthguard and vest required for bulls & steers, vest and mouthguard for

saddle bronc & bareback! If you are participating in Queen Camp you will be contacted by Jamie Dearing for any additional information and or forms.

For your horse...

- Horse(limit one per camper)
- Saddle, bridle, pad, protective boots etc.(whatever you ride your horse in normally) Grooming equipment
- Required equipment for event (vest, helmet, ropes, etc.)
- 5 Gallon flat back water buckets (2 minimum)
- Locking trunk (recommended)
- Saddle stand(optional but recommended)
- Horses feed (enough for 4 days)
- Salt block

For you.....

- Sleeping bag and pillow
- Cot, bedroll or air mattress (will be on concrete)
- Jeans and appropriate shirts (could be very windy and will be chilly at night)
- Boots(required, no tennies, or sandals near horses)
- Helmet (recommended, required for bulls/steers/calves)

Toiletries

- Flashlight
- Manure fork and bucket or wheelbarrow for cleaning stalls(may coordinate with team members when assigned) Stalls MUST be stripped before leaving the grounds.

AWRBC CAMP RULES

(signature required)

We want to support and insure a safe and secure camp for our campers and staff, as well as to provide a positive environment for everyone involved with BBJRBC. To achieve this goal, we ask that all campers adhere to the following rules and guidelines:

1. PLEASE NOTE: Campers who do not follow the camp rules and guidelines are subject to expulsion from camp and will forfeit all paid camp fees.
2. CELL PHONE use is not allowed during camp times unless approved by a staff member. Unauthorized use may result in confiscation of the device until the end of the camp day, campers will NOT be kept from contacting parents at any time during camp.
3. Camp prohibits all other personal electronic devices and are subject to confiscation. We will return the items to the Camper on the last day of camp.
4. Campers may NOT operate any motorized vehicles during camp. This includes personal vehicles.
5. NO alcohol, drugs, or tobacco allowed at camp. This includes chewing tobacco and vaping products. Camp staff/Medic will administer prescription medications daily as needed.
6. We encourage Christ honoring relationships between boys and girls; NO public displays of affection (no laying or sitting on a member of the opposite sex).
7. Campers must not leave the BBJRBC camp facilities and grounds during camp time unless accompanied by a BBJRBC staff member. Camper must notify BBJRBC Staff members before leaving camp with a parent/guardian for any reason.
8. Parents/Guardians must check Campers under eighteen (18) years of age in and out of camp.
9. We expect Campers to be on time for all meals, meetings, and clinic times. We require campers to attend all scheduled activities. Campers may not be in a clinic area unless registered for that event.

10. Campers are to respect and obey the instructions of the counselors, instructors, and camp personnel. Instructors and the Camp Director have final say on all performance parameters for the rodeo.

11. Any Camper defacing camp property must pay for the damage incurred and face expulsion from camp.

12. Horses are not to be out of the stalls except during clinic and rodeo times or for hand walking with knowledge of team leader. Campers must lead horses through the parking lot (no riding of horses on asphalt). There will be no riding of horses on the first day (Sunday) of camp without approval.

13. Humane treatment of animals is always expected . We require reporting of any case of injury or illness to Campers or animals at once.

14. The horse used during camp clinics by the Camper is the horse that they must use during the rodeo. Campers may not switch horses for performance unless specifically approved by the instructor. No exceptions.

Aces Wild Rodeo Bible Camp DRESS CODE

We expect that everyone will dress in a manner pleasing to God and in such a way, which does not draw unnecessary attention to self. To promote a positive environment at camp and for the safety of our campers, AWRBC requires that all campers adhere to the following dress code guidelines while attending camp.

1. All clothing worn by campers should be modest and in good taste.

2. Shorts must be within three inches of the kneecap and only worn during free time. 3. NO Excessively tight or low-riding jeans allowed.

4. NOT ALLOWED - spaghetti strap tops, crop tops, see-through tops, muscle shirts, or cut-off shirts with low-cut armpits. Campers may wear sleeveless shirts with a shoulder strap width of at least two inches that does not reveal the under garments.

5. Campers MUST always wear appropriate undergarments.

6. Campers MUST wear boots around livestock at all times. NO Flip Flops or Tennis Shoes allowed.

7. If a camper is in violation of the dress code, AWRBC staff will ask the camper to change. If the camper refuses or continues to disregard the dress code, they will check-out with their parent/guardian at that time and then return the next day of camp with proper apparel.

By signing this form, we the undersigned, certify that we have read and understand the above rules and guidelines. We also acknowledge the fact that non-compliance with these rules and guidelines may result in the camper's expulsion from camp.
